CHANCELLOR'S ADVISORY COUNCIL Meeting Summary

June 9, 2017

I. Welcome

Chancellor Miner welcomed council members.

II. Approval of May 19, 2017, Meeting Summary

The May 19, 2017, Chancellor's Advisory Council (CAC) meeting summary was approved by consensus.

III. Educational Technology Advisory Committee Recommendation – District Technology Plan

Chien presented the recommendation from the Educational Technology Advisory Committee to approve the District Technology Plan. He also spoke about the process used to develop the plan, which addresses ways in which the colleges' strategic plans can be supported at the district level. The council approved the plan by consensus.

IV. Equity Update Report

Dorene reported that the Equal Employment Opportunity Fund Multiple Method Allocation Model Certification Form has been submitted to the Chancellor's Office and will be presented to the Board of Trustees for ratification on June 12. She praised the work of Pat Hyland to change the way that the district addresses equity in relation to employment.

Pat spoke of some of the changes that have been implemented districtwide, including requiring every member of a hiring committee to complete equal opportunity training, modifying the diversity statement on the job application, not requiring official transcripts at the time of application, working with EquityWorks to map out plans for the next few years, increasing attendance at a number of job fairs, holding a spring convocation, and increasing attendance at the National Conference on Race and Ethnicity (NCORE). She advised that as of yesterday over 350 employees have participated in the new equal opportunity training, including over 70 at De Anza College in the last two weeks, and stated that the training is already having an impact as it is changing the conversation in

hiring committees. Pat also noted that the change in the diversity statement has produced better responses but may still need some adjustment.

With regard to the job fairs, Pat reported that Foothill College had its own suite. Carolyn added that there were potential employees in the suite nearly all day.

Carolyn and Dorene commented about their intense and worthwhile experiences at NCORE that resulted in many takeaways that can be used at the college and district. Dorene called it the best conference she has attended in terms of practical tools and expressed hope that more administrators would attend in the future.

V. Review/evaluation of 2016-2017 CAC Meetings

The council reviewed the list of accomplishments for 2016-2017, and Judy asked for feedback. Mayra made positive comments regarding the program highlights that are now included on the agenda, and Judy asked that members submit suggestions for programs and/or initiatives to feature next year.

VI. Institutional Effectiveness Goals

David reviewed the annual institutional effectiveness goals approved by each of the colleges, which are available at the following California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office website link: https://misweb.ccco.edu/ie/DistrictSelect.aspx as well as on the college websites.

The council had a lengthy discussion about using the data. Carolyn commented that performance outcomes and goals are getting much more specific and the Foothill College Academic Senate has discussed looking deeper into the data. Judy mentioned that the state chancellor has been asking CEOs to do more analysis and also noted that the new metrics for Career Technical Education (CTE) funding are much more complicated with 70 percent tied to outcomes. Mayra stated that De Anza College is integrating metrics into the Educational Master Plan. She also made positive comments about faculty analyzing data to make changes that will help the college meet its goals.

Rich expressed reservations about CTE funding being tied to outcomes, noting that he is concerned about the quality of certificates and would not want to see meaningless data reported. He also cautioned the council about state efforts to turn community colleges into transfer and degree machines, noting that future employment of students should not motivate everything the colleges do.

VII. Call for District Opening Day Workshops and Program Highlights

Judy asked that council members work with colleagues to propose additional applied equity and general training workshops for District Opening Day. She also asked the council to share videos or photos featuring programs that are making a difference in improving equity. Chris suggested that equal employment opportunity training be held on opening day.

VIII. Enrollment and District Enrollment Management Committee

Thuy reported that Foothill College's late spring did not match last year's early summer enrollment, but it did generate more enrollment than estimated. She stated that summer enrollment is strong so far and that the college is looking at new populations of students to recruit.

Judy announced that Martha Kanter has been confirmed as the keynote speaker for the College Promise event on September 27, spoke about improved success rates for online courses presented by Lorrie Ranck at the All Administrators and Supervisors meeting held earlier in the day, and thanked the De Anza Associated Student Body for successful advocacy efforts with the Valley Transportation Authority since transportation can be a barrier to retention.

IX. Recognition of Outgoing Chancellor's Advisory Council Members

Chancellor Miner thanked Isaac for serving on the council as District Academic Senate President during 2016-2017 and commented that he had exceeded all her expectations. She also praised Associated Students of Foothill College President Ramiel Petros and noted that he was not able to attend his final CAC meeting due to surgery.

Speaking of their long history of service together in the district, Judy thanked Rich for his work as a faculty member, Faculty Association (FA) President, and statewide leader. She praised his skill with numbers as well as his kindness.

Rich acknowledged that FA and administration don't always agree, but should try to find a way to move forward. He said it has been an honor to serve the district and called community colleges a grand social experiment that he will protect as long as he has breath.

VII. Other Information and Updates

The meeting adjourned at 4:00 p.m.

Office Chancellor's Office

(Note: The new requirement that the agenda be posted on the primary home page of the district also applies to all of the district's Brown Act committees, including the Audit and Finance Committee, Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee, Foothill-De Anza Foundation Board of Directors, De Anza and Foothill Academic Senates, ASFC, and DASB. At the CCLC policy and procedures workshop, we were advised that a link to BoardDocs from the district's home page is sufficient for the Board, Audit and Finance, and CBOC agendas posted there. We will need to develop process for all of the other meeting agendas to have a link from the district home page by January 2019.)

An agenda shall be posted adjacent to the place of meeting <u>as well as on the District's internet website</u> at least 72 hours prior to the meeting time for regular meetings. The agenda shall include a brief description of each item of business to be transacted or discussed at the meeting. If requested, the agenda shall be provided in appropriate alternative formats so as to be accessible to persons with a disability.

Agendas shall be developed by the Chancellor in consultation with the Board President. Additionally, any two members of the board may submit to the Chancellor an item for discussion or consideration on the agenda.

No business may be acted on or discussed which is not on the agenda, except when one or more of the following apply:

- A majority decides there is an "emergency situation" as defined for emergency meetings;
- Two-thirds of the members (or all members if less than two-thirds are present) determine there is a need for immediate action and the need to take action came to the attention of the Board subsequent to the agenda being posted;
- An item appeared on the agenda of and was continued from a meeting held not more than five days earlier.

The order of business may be changed by consent of the Board.

The Chancellor shall establish administrative procedures that provide for public access to agenda information.

Members of the public may place matters directly related to District business on an agenda by submitting a written summary of the item to the Chancellor. The written summary must be signed by the initiator and contain his/her residence or business address and organizational affiliation, if any. Agenda items submitted by members of the public must be received by the Chancellor's Office no later than two weeks prior to the regularly scheduled Board meeting and shall be placed on the Board's agenda following the items of business initiated by the Board and staff. The Board reserves the right to consider and take action in closed session on items submitted by members of the public as permitted or required by law.

Any agenda item submitted by a member of the public and heard at a public meeting cannot be resubmitted by the member of the public before the expiration of a 90-day period following the initial submission.

Office Chancellor's Office

Persons may speak to the Board either on an agenda item or on other matters of interest to the public that are within the subject matter jurisdiction of the Board.

Oral presentations relating to a matter on the agenda, including those on the consent agenda, shall be heard before a vote is called on the item.

Persons wishing to speak to matters not on the agenda shall do so at the time designated at the meeting for public hearings.

Those wishing to speak to the Board are subject to the following:

- No member of the public may speak without being recognized by the President of the Board.
- The President of the Board may rule members of the public out of order if their remarks do not pertain to matters that are within the subject matter jurisdiction of the Board or if their remarks are unduly repetitive.
- Non-scheduled substitutes may not speak in place of scheduled speakers unless alternates have been submitted on the original request.
- Employees who are members of a bargaining unit represented by an exclusive bargaining agent may address the Board under this policy, but may not attempt to negotiate terms and conditions of their employment. This policy does not prohibit any employee from addressing a collective bargaining proposal pursuant to the public notice requirements of Government Code Section 3547 and the policies of this Board implementing that section.

Addressing Items on the Agenda

Members of the public are able to address the Board regarding items on the agenda as such items are taken up. Members of the public who wish to address the Board on items on the agenda shall complete a written request to the Chancellor at the beginning of the meeting at which they wish to speak. The request shall note the item on which they wish to speak and identify the submitter by name and by organizational affiliation, if any. In order to ensure the orderly conduct of public business, unless the Governing Board otherwise directs at the time, citizens wishing to discuss agendized matters with the Board at Board meetings shall be limited to five

minutes per person. <u>Speakers who use a translator shall be limited to ten minutes per person</u>. The Board President may at his/her discretion limit the total number of speakers addressing a particular subject and/or reduce the minutes allowed per person below five minutes.

Addressing Items Not on the Agenda

This regulation shall not preclude the taking of public testimony or comment during the Public Hearings at regularly-scheduled meetings on matters not on the agenda which any member of the public may wish to bring before the Board, provided that no action is taken by the Board on such matters at the same meeting at which such testimony or comment is taken. In order to facilitate such interaction with the public, each meeting agenda shall include a time for general public input on any matter not otherwise covered in the agenda for that meeting. Members of the public who wish to address the Board during the Public Hearing shall complete a written request to the Chancellor at the beginning of the meeting at which they wish to speak. The request shall identify the subject and the submitter by name and by organizational affiliation, if any. The Board President may at his/her discretion limit the total number of speakers addressing a particular subject and/or reduce the minutes allowed per person below five minutes. **Speakers**who use a translator shall be limited to double the alotted amount of time.

Each speaker coming before the Board is limited to one presentation per specific agenda item before the Board and to one presentation per meeting on non-agenda matters.

Office College Presidents

The curricular offerings of the College will include transfer, occupational, general education, and developmental courses for members of the community. Emphasis is not to be given to any of these to the exclusion of others. The Colleges are committed to offering courses with the appropriate content and methodologies to meet the needs of our diverse student populations. The Colleges, relying on the Academic Senate and with the full involvement of the Associated Students and the administration will continuously be alert to the educational needs of the community so they can present for Board consideration new and appropriate community college programs.

Where it is to mutual advantage, the Colleges will include in their considerations the possibility of offering a course or program in conjunction with an adjacent community college or local school district.

All curriculum changes and additions will be examined for recommendation of adoption or non-adoption by a Curriculum Committee. After examining the Committee's evaluation of the curriculum, Academic Senate, through the CIO, will forward the curriculum to the Chancellor for placement on the agenda of the Board of Trustees. However, in conformity with Policy 3280 and in recognition of the need to submit applications for grants by deadline dates, the Chancellor may, where time is a factor, proceed with steps necessary to apply for a grant prior to the recommendation of a curriculum by a Curriculum Committee.

The Curriculum Committee will be notified immediately when such a grant application is being considered, and any recommendations for curriculum changes will be made by the Committee prior to the effective date of the grant.

(NOTE: This policy is **legally required**. The following policy indicates that the Board retains authority to approve new programs and courses, and discontinue programs, and delegates the authority for all other actions to the CEO. It is the option we legally advise, but options that delegate all authority to the CEO or that require Board approval for new courses and discontinue courses are legal. However, it is suggested that Boards not require program or course modifications be submitted to them for approval. The portion of this policy regarding credit hour definition is **legally required** in an effort to show good faith compliance with the applicable federal regulations.)

The programs and curricula of the District shall be of high quality, relevant to community and student needs, and evaluated regularly to ensure quality and currency. To that end, the Chancellor shall establish procedures for the development and review of all curricular offerings, including their establishment, modification, or discontinuance.

Furthermore, these procedures shall include:

- primary or joint reliance, as appropriate, of the faculty and Academic Senate in all processes;
- regular review and justification of programs and course descriptions;
- opportunities for training for persons involved in aspects of curriculum development; and
- · consideration of job market and other related information for career and technical education programs.

All new programs and program discontinuances shall be approved by the Board of Trustees.

All new programs shall be submitted to the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office for approval as required.

<u>Individual degree-applicable credit courses offered as part of a permitted educational program shall be approved by the Board.</u> Non-degree-applicable credit and degree-applicable courses that are not part of an existing approved program must satisfy the conditions authorized by Title 5 regulations and shall be approved by the Board.

Credit Hour

Consistent with federal regulations applicable to federal financial aid eligibility, the District shall assess and designate each of its programs as either a "credit hour" program or a "clock hour" program.

The Chancellor will establish procedures which prescribe the definition of "credit hour" consistent with applicable federal regulations, as they apply to community college districts.

The Chancellor shall establish procedures to assure that curriculum at the District complies with the definition of "credit hour" or "clock hour," where applicable. The Chancellor shall also establish procedure for using a clock-to-credit hour conversion formula to determine whether a credit hour program is eligible for federal financial aid. The conversion formula is used to determine whether such a credit-hour program has an appropriate minimum number of clock hours of instruction for each credit hour it claims.

The Board authorizes the fees set forth below:

Enrollment Fee (Education Code Section 76300)

Each student shall be charged a fee for enrolling in credit courses as required by law.

Baccalaureate Degree Pilot Program Fees (Title 5, Section 58520)

Each student shall be charged a fee in addition to an enrollment fee for upper division coursework in a baccalaureate degree pilot program.

Auditing Fee (Education Code Section 76370)

Persons auditing a course shall be charged a fee of ten dollars (\$10) per unit per quarter. Students enrolled in classes to receive credit for 15 or more quarter credit units shall not be charged an auditing fee to audit five or fewer units per quarter.

Health Fee (Education Code Section 76355)

The District shall charge each student a fee of sixteen seventeen dollars (\$16) (\$17) for health supervision and services.

Parking Fee (Education Code Section 76360)

Students shall be required to pay a fee for parking services. The Chancellor shall present for board approval fees for parking for students.

Instructional Materials (Education Code Section 76365; Title 5, Sections 59400 et seq.)

Students may be required to provide required instructional and other materials for a credit or non-credit course, provided such materials are of continuing value to the student outside the classroom and provided that such materials are not solely or exclusively available from the District.

Physical Education Facilities (Education Code Section 76395)

Where the District incurs additional expenses because a physical education course is required to use non-district facilities, students enrolled in the course shall be charged a fee for participating in the course. Such fee shall not exceed the student's calculated share of the additional expenses incurred by the district.

Student Representation Fee (Education Code Section 76060.5)

As authorized by the colleges, students will be charged a per quarter fee to be used to provide support for student governmental affairs representation. A student may refuse to pay the fee for religious, political, financial or moral reasons and shall submit such refusal in writing.

Student Transportation Costs (Education Code Section 76361)

Students shall be charged a fee for the purpose of recovering transportation costs incurred by the District for services provided by common carriers to students. The fee shall be five dollars (\$5) for full time students enrolled in 12 or more units, four dollars (\$4) for part-time students enrolled in 6 to 11.9 units, and three dollars (\$3) for students enrolled in fewer than 6 units. (Note: Will need to update once student governments vote on the increase.)

Transcript Fees (Education Code Section 76223)

The District shall charge a reasonable amount for furnishing copies of any student record to a student or former student. The Chancellor is authorized to establish the fee, which shall not exceed the actual cost of furnishing copies of any student record. No charge shall be made for furnishing up to two transcripts of a student's records or for two verifications of various records. There shall be no charge for searching for or retrieving any student record.

International Students Application Processing Fee (Education Code Section 76142)

The District shall charge students who are both citizens and residents of a foreign country a fee to process his/her application for admission. The processing fee and regulations for determining economic hardship may be established by the Chancellor. The fee shall not exceed the lesser of 1) the actual cost of processing an application and other documentation required by the United States government or 2) one hundred dollars (\$100), which shall be deducted from the tuition fee at the time of enrollment.

The Chancellor shall establish procedures for the collection, deposit, waiver, refund, and accounting for fees as required by law. The procedures shall also ensure that those who are exempt from or for whom the fee is waived are properly enrolled and accounted for. Fee amounts shall be published in the college catalogs.

Students who wish to apply for a Board of Governors Fee Waiver pursuant to Education Code Section 76300 shall be required to complete and submit either a Free Application for Federal Student Aid or a California Dream Act application in lieu of completing the Board of Governors Fee Waiver application.
